Highlights of 2024

The Grand Valley Public Library plays an important role in the community. The Grand Valley Public Library Board and the Staff continue to strive to bring new and innovative ideas to the community residents. This year we made great strides in meeting some of the goals of the 2022-2025 strategic plan.

Community Awareness: If there was an event we tried to be there. Duck Day Race, Farmers Market and the Fall Fair.

Inspired Opportunities: With the help from the Greenwood Family Fund and Dufferin Community Foundation, the library continued to provide cooking classes for children from grades 5-8, increasing the number of classes by 60% from 2023. The library was also able to create incredible opportunities for our summer programs. A TD summer reading launch party, a TD summer reading Closing Foam Party and an amazing prize for the child with the highest number of books read. We cannot forget the Tween Dance, which the library partnered up with the GV Agricultural Society's Fall Fair event where the children danced away for 2 hours of fun.

Service Excellence: Great customer service is a priority here at the library. Staff are continually improving their skills and education to help serve you better. The library had our first PD day, with all staff attending a day of training on customer service, reader's advisory and Indigenous Reconciliation Training.

Plan for the Future: The Library Board sub-committee presented to the Town of Grand Valley a functional program for the Council to plan on the size and future needs of the library in the upcoming years.
