This is a **Sale** Permit.

I understand, as a holder of a Public Event Sale Permit, that money can be collected for liquor (e.g., through an admission charge, the sale of liquor or liquor tickets to attendees, or the collection of money for liquor before the event). Funds may be raised through the sale of liquor.

This permit must be presented at the LCBO, The Beer Store or any licensed Ontario winery or brewery or distillery store to purchase or return liquor. The permit must be readily available for presentation upon request at the event.

IMPORTANT

If for some reason the Permit Holder listed on this permit is unable to attend this event, then the Permit Holder **must** designate another person to attend on their behalf. The Permit Holder and the Designated Person are responsible for ensuring that the event is in compliance with the *Liquor Licence and Control Act, 2019* and Regulations. **Note:** The Designated Person must not be someone who, less than 2 years before the application for the permit is made, has been refused a Special Occasion Permit by the Registrar. To assign a Designated Person who will attend and be responsible for the event, the following must be completed, dated and signed by both the Permit Holder and the Designated Person.

REMINDER:

- The Permit Holder is legally responsible. Know your responsibilities, refer to the *Liquor Licence and Control Act, 2019* and Regulations. The Permit Holder as indicated on the Permit must attend the event.
- You may only sell and serve liquor that was purchased on this permit through the LCBO, or The Beer Store or any licensed Ontario winery, brewery or distillery store. For Private Events you may serve wine and/or beer made by a member of the family hosting a wedding, anniversary or other family special occasion. You must acquire the wine and beer free of charge, and you must not sell the wine and beer but serve them free of charge.
- Only certain persons permitted to conduct Public Events or Auction Events are eligible to receive donated liquor, and liquor may only be donated by a manufacturer.
- You may not raffle liquor or hold contests that involve buying, drinking, or winning liquor.
- Do not serve illegal and home-made liquor (see exception for Private Events, above).
- No guest shall be allowed to remove or bring in liquor (except in accordance with the Regulations).
- Hire servers of liquor who are at least 18 years of age and it is recommended that they have taken the Smart Serve Training Program.
- Ensure that the sale, service and consumption of liquor is monitored. At no time should excessive drinking be encouraged, nor shall liquor be served to guests who are or appear to be intoxicated, or who are under 19 years of age.
- Do not allow guests to drink and drive. Be prepared to arrange alternative transportation for guests who need or request it.
- Assign trained staff to monitor the door and ensure the number of people at the event are within the lawful capacity allowed for the premises.
