Nature of business to be discussed, course of action and reasons (what you would like Council to do) *

On Tue Oct07/25 I was involved in a motor vehicle accident while attempting to exit south out of the GV FoodBank parking lot. This was the day of a large funeral which saw patrons of In Memoriam park in both the Medical Centre & FoodBank parking lots, as well as lining the entire east side of Main St North from the Municipal Office all the way to Webb St. The marked parking spots along Main St North end at the Medical Centre and they should not have been parked past that area since it seriously impedes the driveway of the FoodBank. Also, In Memoriam had completely filled the FoodBank parking lot, which in turn caused undue stress to the clients since they had no where to park while they were at the FoodBank. I feel In Memoriam is abusing this parking lot, since it has been empty for so long but is now required to be available on a regular basis for the clients accessing the FoodBank and other services that will be provided in the building. Not only were the cars impeding a safe exit, one vehicle was actually encroaching on the driveway itself. As I attempted to inch my way out of the parking lot, knowing full well that visibility was limited, I was struck by a vehicle heading north. This caused inconvenience to the other vehicle operator, major damage to their vehicle and seriously hindered their fall vacation. My vehicle sustained \$15,000 damage, I had to get a rental for one month, and I was deemed at fault by the insurance which will likely affect my next insurance renewal! In speaking with Brad Haines, ByLaw Officer, on Oct07 I was told that "usually Randy has someone directing traffic when a large number of vehicles are expected". I replied that indeed In Memoriam's attendant was indicating that their parking lot was full and patrons should park either across the road or along the Main St North. It is very unsafe for patrons to park on Main St North, open their doors wide into oncoming traffic and then have to maneuver their way across a major roadway to get to In Memoriam, when if they had parked at the Community Centre they could easily exit their vehicles, take their time and use the sidewalk to get to In Memoriam's property. Why was ByLaw not made aware of anticipated extra parking requirements by In Memoriam? and why was the vehicle that encroached the FoodBank driveway not ticketed?

Also of note, on Oct28 there was another large funeral at which time the FoodBank parking lot was again filled with In Memoriam patrons and provided no parking at all for FoodBank clients.

I am imploring Council to discuss these issues with In Memoriam and not wait until a very serious accident happens at this location. I also respectfully request a written update on this matter at Council's earliest convenience.

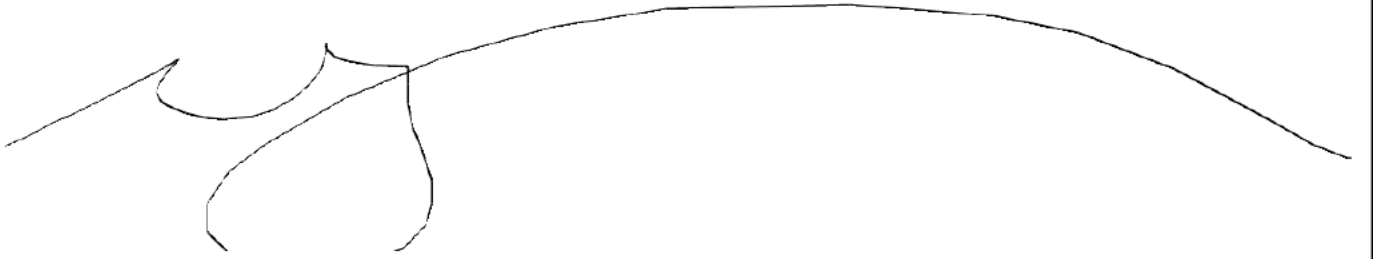
