RE: Request for Septic Disposal Access at Grand Valley Treatment Facility

Dear Meghan Townsend and Town of Grand Valley Council,

I am writing on behalf of Allto Construction to formally request authorization for our company to discharge hauled septic waste at the Grand Valley Wastewater Treatment Facility.

Allto Construction provides septic pumping, hauling, and disposal services throughout the region, including Dufferin County. We are a local, tax paying business that has been operating in the community since 1969 and currently employ approximately 50 people from the surrounding area.

Currently, sewage must be transported to facilities outside the area, resulting in increased hauling distances, higher costs, and operational inefficiencies that are ultimately passed on to residents.

Authorizing Allto Construction to access the Grand Valley facility would provide a practical local solution. It would allow sewage collected from Dufferin County residents to be processed closer to source, reducing service costs while improving efficiency.

Additionally, reducing long haul transport distances has a direct environmental benefit. Fewer kilometers traveled means reduced fuel consumption, lower emissions, and less wear on regional infrastructure, aligning with broader sustainability objectives.

It is understood that the treatment facility was designed with capacity beyond its current usage and has maintained this surplus capacity. This creates an opportunity for the Town to generate additional revenue through a controlled, company specific authorization with a standard per volume fee structure.

Allto Construction is prepared to meet any operational, regulatory, and reporting requirements necessary to ensure full compliance with municipal standards.
